FEO and BIS will be allowed at this trial!

FEO will be allowed at this trial. Handlers must declare FEO as they enter the ring. Teams will be given a maximum time of standard course time. When running FEO, the handler may use a toy to reward the dog. At no time may the toy leave the handler's possession or be thrown, or they will be excused from the ring. No food, no toys that make noise and no balls that can roll away may be used. The handler may train any piece of equipment as many times as they would like. Handlers may touch equipment during the FEO run, which includes resetting the bars.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

- **VENDORS attending:** Food and canine massage.
- A shooting range is a mile away and may be heard in the distance.
- Dogs must be on leash except when in the ring or at the practice jump.
- **Bathroom** facilities are port-a-potties, running water is available inside the barn.

- The show ring is indoors on dirt.
- Be respectful of the ring entry and exit area and keep these areas clear for dogs entering / exiting the ring.
- No aggressive dogs.
- A practice jump will be provided for exhibitors.
- **Crating** is out of your vehicle. Please plan accordingly.
- **No Smoking.** Smoking is not permitted inside our facility and not encouraged outside near others. We prefer if you must smoke that it is done inside your vehicle and that your butts are discarded in your vehicle ashtray.
- The **GSCA and Feel The Rush** will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site.

WORKERS

INTERNATIONAL SWEEPSTAKES CLASSES (ISC):

This event is NOT World Team Qualifying Event, meaning there will NOT be an automatic invite of the combined winners to WTT.

ISC level description & info:

- A1 (STD 1) and J1 (JWW 1) are the beginning levels of FCI/ISC Courses.
- A2 (STD 2) and J2 (JWW 2) are the intermediate levels of FCI/ISC Courses.
- A3 (STD 3) and J3 (JWW 3) are the master levels of FCI/ISC Courses.

Teams may enter any / all levels offered daily.

Purpose: The International Sweepstakes Class (ISC) is a non-regular class providing the dog and handler an opportunity to demonstrate their advanced training and handling skills on various International Style Standard and Jumpers with Weaves courses. The rules for this class are generally based on international rules. The variety in International Agility course designs is very diverse, so handlers should be prepared to meet the "Challenge of the Day" when competing in the ISC class. The total challenge level may be easier, more difficult, or simply different from what is currently allowed in Excellent / Master Classes. Complete rules for the ISC are available from the AKC Website (<http://www.akc.org>)

Eligibility: ISC classes are open to dogs that are eligible to compete in AKC agility trials. Competitors are eligible to enter any and multiple levels in the same day. **There is NO Preferred option for ISC; dogs may enter and jump at their Preferred jump height;** however, they will be scored against their respective regular jump height peers.

Qualifications: "Clean run" scores for dogs who measure into ISC heights in the 12", 16", 20" and 24" classes may be used toward fulfilling the requirements for WTT/EOTT. A "clean run" consists of a run without time or course faults. *As of January 2023, Level 1 clean runs do NOT count toward WTT qualifiers, only Levels 2 and 3. All levels count towards EOTT qualifiers.

ISC Jump Heights: Dogs may enter at their regular AKC jump height or their preferred height. Only those dogs running in the 12", 16", 20 and 24" classes that meet the FCI/ISC measuring cutoff (different than regular AKC cutoffs) will be eligible for their score to count towards the qualification to WTT or EOTT. The FCI/ISC cutoffs for these heights are:

- Small (12" jump height) - for dogs measuring 13 ¾" or less at the withers.
- Medium (16" jump height) - for dogs measuring more than 13 ¾" but less than 16 ⅞" at the withers.
- Intermediate (20" jump height) – for dogs measuring more than 16 ⅞" but less than 18 ⅞"
- Large (24" jump height) – for dogs measuring over 18 ⅞" at the withers.

GSCA - RIBBONS, AWARDS AND PRIZES

Flat Ribbons will be awarded in each jump height in **each class**:

First Place	Rose
Second Place.....	Brown
Third Place.....	Light Green
Fourth Place.....	Gray

Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the event committee, be asked to leave show site. In such a case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. **GSCA, Feel The Rush Agility Trial Secretary Services** and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. **GSCA** reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the **GSCA** or any official thereof. **All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.**

OBSTACLES AND RING CONDITIONS

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the regulations for Agility Trials. Jumps for ISC classes will have 4" bars.

The trial will take place indoors on GROOMED DIRT. Ring size will be 74'W x 120'L.

Dogs jumping 24 for ISC will enter the 24" class, not 24C.

MEASURING and HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION.

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the jump height card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured/wicketed by the Judge of Record PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. The exception to this requirement is a dog entered in the 24" height division. However, if a Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO) or an Agility Field Rep is present; ALL dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog wicketed by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog before its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores. MEASURING and HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION Simplified Jump Height Card Process

When filling out the entry form, there is a new section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether your dog needs to be officially measured. Please check the box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the Dogs To Be Measured List. Turn left onto Spicer Hill Rd. Turn left onto CT-214 E. Turn right onto Spicer Hill Rd. Continue onto Gallup Hill Rd.

RT. 95 NORTH: Use the left lane to merge onto I-95 N/US-1 toward New London – Providence. Keep right at the fork to stay on I-95N, follow signs for New London/Providence. No entry shall be made, and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each check.

REFUNDS - After closing date but prior to start of trial:

Refund requests for bitches in season. This must include a veterinarian's note to be received by the trial secretary before the first run on the day of the trial. After the close of entries, \$7.00 per run will be withheld from refunds. Requests for refunds received after the start of the trial will not be given for any reason. There shall be no refunds for entries withdrawn after the closing date (except for the reasons and conditions listed above) or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of reason for such dismissal. No entry fees will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any cause beyond control of organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the trial Committee.

WAIT LIST INFORMATION

GSCA is offering a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date/time. An unlimited number of entries will be placed on the club's wait list. All entries, including waitlisted entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary prior to **Wednesday Oct 28, at 6PM EST.** Any entries withdrawn that are received by **Wednesday Oct 28 at 6PM EST** that are replaced by a wait list entry will receive a full refund for the withdrawn entry. Any waitlisted entry that does not move off wait list into the trial by **Friday Oct 31, 2025, at 6pm EST** will receive a full refund. (Trial Secretary will destroy entry and check).

RINGSIDE

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging if dog has valid temporary or permanent jump height card. Otherwise, dogs must be available for measuring prior to the start of their class if a VMO or AKC Field Rep is available to measure dogs. All dogs not needed for further judging will be excused. Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The owner/handler of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. **GSCA** has no responsibility for providing service through public address system or stewards or runners for purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into ring when required. The club agrees to arbitrate claims as set forth on Official AKC Entry Form

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing /Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), or AKC Canine Partners listing number, approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used it includes both sexes.

Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under four months of age are strictly prohibited from trial grounds.

Please consult the *AKC Regulations for Agility Trials* for a complete description & eligibility for entry into these classes. Exhibitor is fully responsible for entering dog in correct class/height divisions. COURSE WALK-THROUGHS INFORMATION

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only. Handlers with multiple dogs, at events with multiple rings may request to walk with a height group other than the one their dog is entered in if a conflict is imminent. A warm-up area, consisting of one regulation agility jump for each ring, may be provided for exhibitors. Warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog.

INSTRUCTIONS. Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes must compete at the required jump height and may not compete in a jump height division higher or lower than their proper height division. Dogs jumping their preferred height in ISC classes will be scored with their regular height class.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine Partners ProgramSM may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler Number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner?
